READING AT NEWCHURCH

'A reader lives a thousand lives before he dies...The man who never reads lives only one.' George R.R Martin

At Newchurch, reading is at the core of all our learning. This year, we continue to strive to help our children find pleasure in a great book of any genre. We have high expectations of our children when it comes to reading, expecting them to:

- read at least 20 minutes every day;
- ensure to keep their reading records up-to-date with signatures from parents (at least two per week);
- be fully engaged in the reading curriculum we provide; and
- strive to achieve the Bronze, Silver and Gold Awards on our Reading Rewards by reading and changing their books regularly.

This year, we are focusing on developing the children's vocabulary. You will see a slight change in the children's reading records, with 'additional reading' being replaced by 'My WOW word'. This does not mean that additional reading is not encouraged but can be noted in the section where the days of the week are instead.

We are encouraging the children to select one word each week (from their reading of any text) and write it in their reading record. They **must** know the meaning of the word. Each Friday, the words will be collected and shared with the class and it will be decided who is to be the 'Vocabulary Detective of the Week'.

SEND REVIEW

Over the last year we have been working closely with Warrington Inclusion Hub. This has been recognised by the school gaining the Committed to Inclusion Award for the second year running. As part of our continuing commitment to provide every child a flying start, we requested a review of our provision for children with Special Educational Needs and Disability last half term. During the review, the team observed lessons, looked at children's books and met with parents, children, staff and Jean Williams (Chair of Governors and Governor responsible for SEND). 'It is the view of the review team that Newchurch provides excellent care and support for the pupils with special educational needs at the school.'

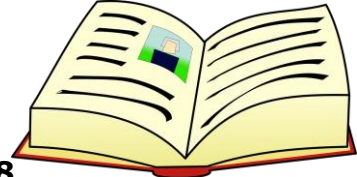
