supermarkets and purchase goods which they can donate to Warrington Foodbank. What a




We are ready to dive into our next book!


Y3: This half term, Year Three are looking at the book 'Dolphin Boy' written by Michael Morpurgo. The story of Dolphin Boy is about Jim who is a young boy living in a struggling fishing village. Upon meeting a stranded dolphin, Jim and the rest of the villagers are distracted from their worries in a bid to save the dolphin. As a result, the dolphin embarks upon a relationship with Jim that brings a new sense of hope to all of the villagers.



Y4: Linked to their learning in Geography, the children will be looking at this book by award-winning author/illustrator Celia Godkin, who once again turns to the subject of nature's remarkable ability to renew itself in this beautiful new book. A small island in the Pacific exists in perfect harmony, where all the plants, animals and people are interdependent. But the islanders live with the knowledge that their mountain god sometimes grumbles and threatens to awake. When that happens, the people offer up prayers and garlands of flowers to coax the giant back to sleep.



Y5: Shackleton's Journey is a unique visual re-telling of Ernest Shackleton's landmark expedition crossing the Antarctic from one pole to the other. Already the children have been using their inference skills to make predictions about what will happen.



Y6: This half term, Year 6 will be studying the text 'Matchbox Diary' by Paul Fleischman which is a magnificent picture book about a girl who meets her great-grandfather for the first time, and with the help of little keepsakes in an old cigar box, hears the story of his childhood and his family's journey from Italy to the USA. The story is full of awe and wonder where each little matchbox tells its own adventure. The brilliant storytelling is likely to capture the imagination of the children, and the ideas from the text will be used to inspire them to develop their own creative writing skills.


