Arts Award Celebration

We are delighted to announce that we have once again been awarded the Arts Award, a validation of the school's commitment to the Arts. In order to achieve the award, Newchurch had to show a dedication to the teaching of dance, art and design, music and drama, including providing children with a range of opportunities to perform in front of audiences as well as sharing good practice with other schools beyond our own. Many thanks in particular to Mr Duckett who has led us towards achieving this.

Parent Board Updates

Parent Board is a group of parents who represent each class and work with the school to develop areas of communication, curriculum and effective partnership between home and school for the benefit of the children. It meets every half term with a clear agenda. Everyone's voice is important and very much welcomed. Over the last few years, the suggestions from the Parent Board have led to changes in homework and the school reporting system. At the meeting before Christmas we looked at residential, parents' evening and parent workshops.

Residential Visits

After a consultation evening in the Autumn term it has been decided that there will be a residential in Year 2. As of next year the following will happen:

- Y2 – Beeston (current Y1 will be the first to go)
- Y4 – Kingswood (current Y3 will be the first to go)
- Y6 – Arete (current Y5 will be the first to go)

The current Y4 will still go to Beeston this year.

At the consultation evening, it was agreed that the school would set up a payment plan over 12 months to help with the financial planning of our families. 
The Christmas fair raised £1,211.66. Thank you to all those that supported the event.
