Reverend Stafford showed the children lots of amazing science experiments, which included creating alternative sounds using a slinky and a bucket, a robot finding its way around a track and there was even a floating shark keeping its eye on the children. As always it was a fun filled assembly which was

thoroughly enjoyed by both children and staff.

Jamie Year 5: I liked the robot shark in the assembly that represented the whale that gobbled up Jonah the Moaner because it was really cool. Reverend Stafford also showed us how the laser blaster sounds were made in Star Wars using a bucket and a slinky.

TTRockSTARS

As you may now be aware, each child's reading record now contains a section for them to mark off when they have accessed TTRockstars. The aim is to increase the number of children using the amazing APP to develop their tables knowledge. Multiplication tables are vital in all year groups and, aside from year four's multiplication exam, tend to make up 75% of the year six arithmetic test. The expectation is similar to reading in that the children access the APP twice per week, though more frequent use will greatly increase the children's ability to apply their tables.

PAN

Those of you who were at the Parr Hall on Monday evening will testify to the amazing performance of Y4. The children took part in the annual PAN performance and dazzled the audience with their Roman inspired dancing and drumming. Being first on stage did not faze them at all and they not only showed great professionalism but also wonderful creativity in their work.
