



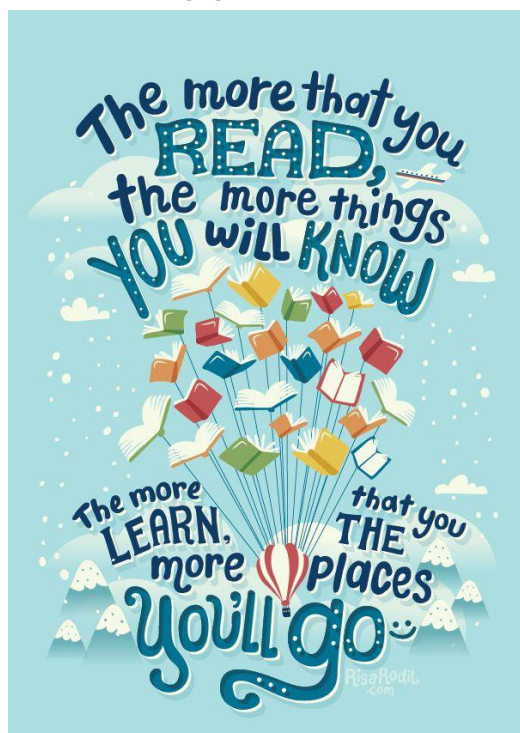

Harry: We cut safely using knives.

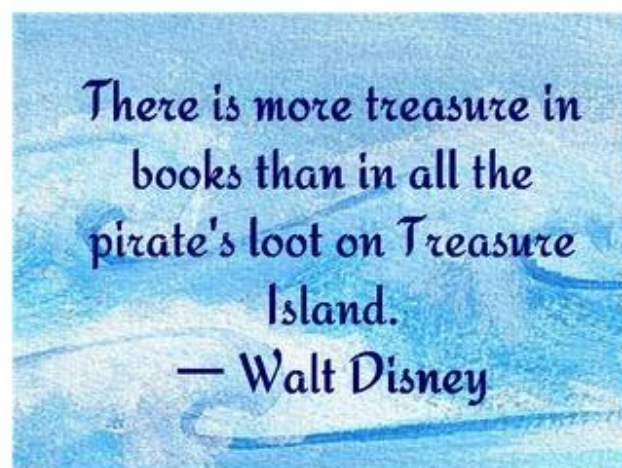
Year 2: We have celebrated Book Week with an African theme. In DT, the children have made fruit smoothies including fruit grown in Africa – delicious!

Year 3 have been very busy this week. They have been learning all about Thailand. They started the week becoming chefs by preparing and cooking our Thai red

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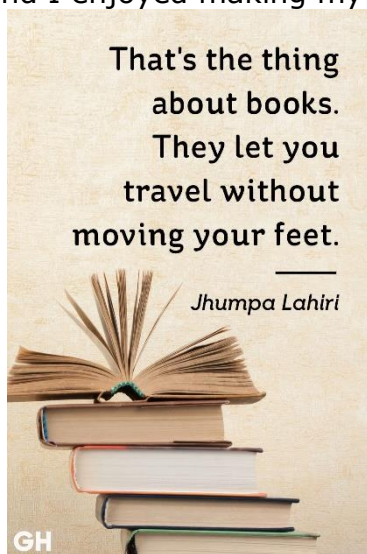

They then applied their learning to produce their own treasure maps which incorporated the aforementioned learning.

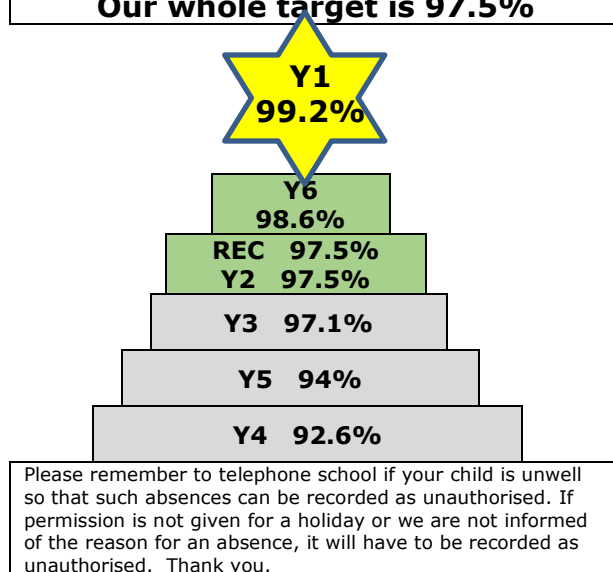
