The team, championed by one of our parent governors, spent the whole day clearing the top of the field and the pond area in preparation for Stage Two: the establishment of the fire pit and the tool shed. We can not thank them enough for their time. This is something that would have taken us so long to achieve.

At parents' evening, there was information in the. entrance hall regarding how you can support us in. this projec but just in case you missed it, here's. how you can help:

- · Do you know any builders who would be willing to help us?
- · Could you supply building materials and / or labour to lay a concrete base for our tool shed? It's. a large area reaching 4.2m x 2.1m
- · The sourcing of / cost towards limestone• chippings that we would need to ensure that the areas are safe to use?
- ·The sourcing of / cost towards a protective barrier to prevent regrowth in areas renovated?
- · Supplying evergreen and other trees to enhance our woodland area?
- · Supplying wheel barrows and other tools to use for our renovation plans
- · The labour required for planting trees and other low level foliage?
- · Do you have links to any local community groups who may be able to offer voluntary labour support our renovating areas e.q rangers? Please could you give us a contact name of someone we can link in with?
- · Do you have any special skills or connections that may be useful for us to know?


